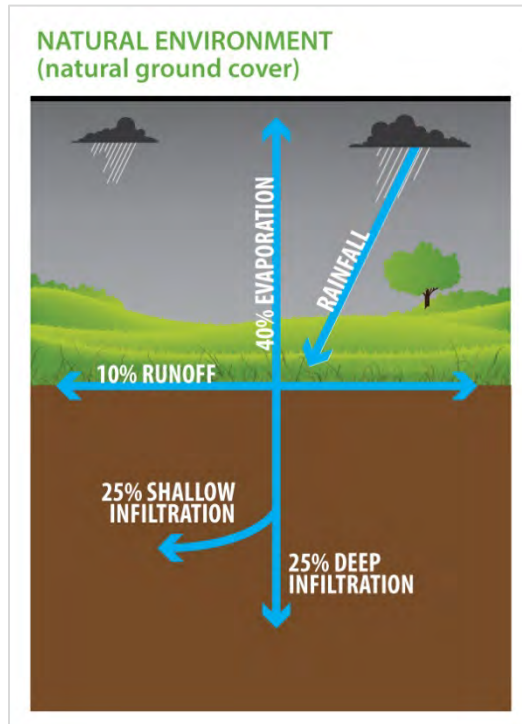

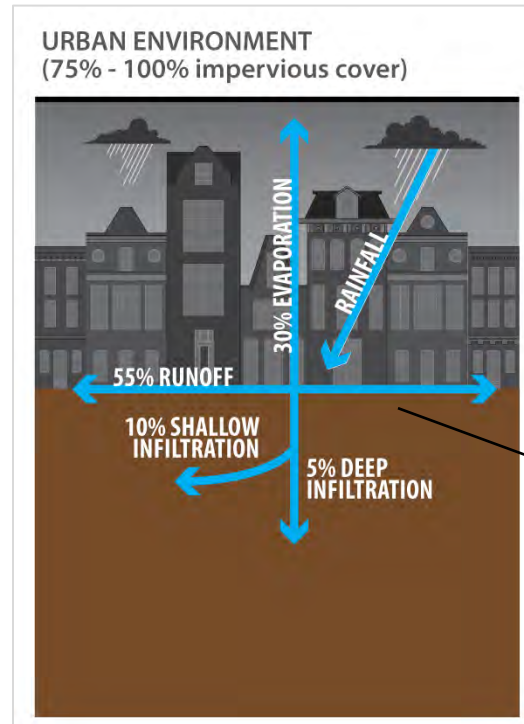


Background: Why Stormwater is a Problem in DC and Other Cities



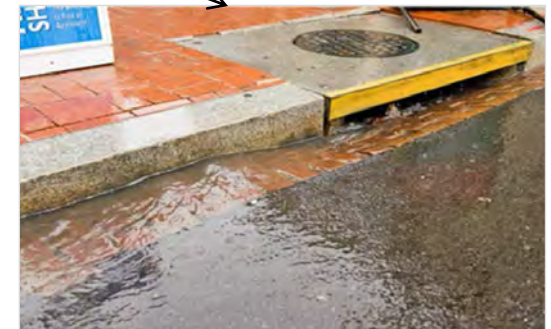
Natural Environment:

Surface

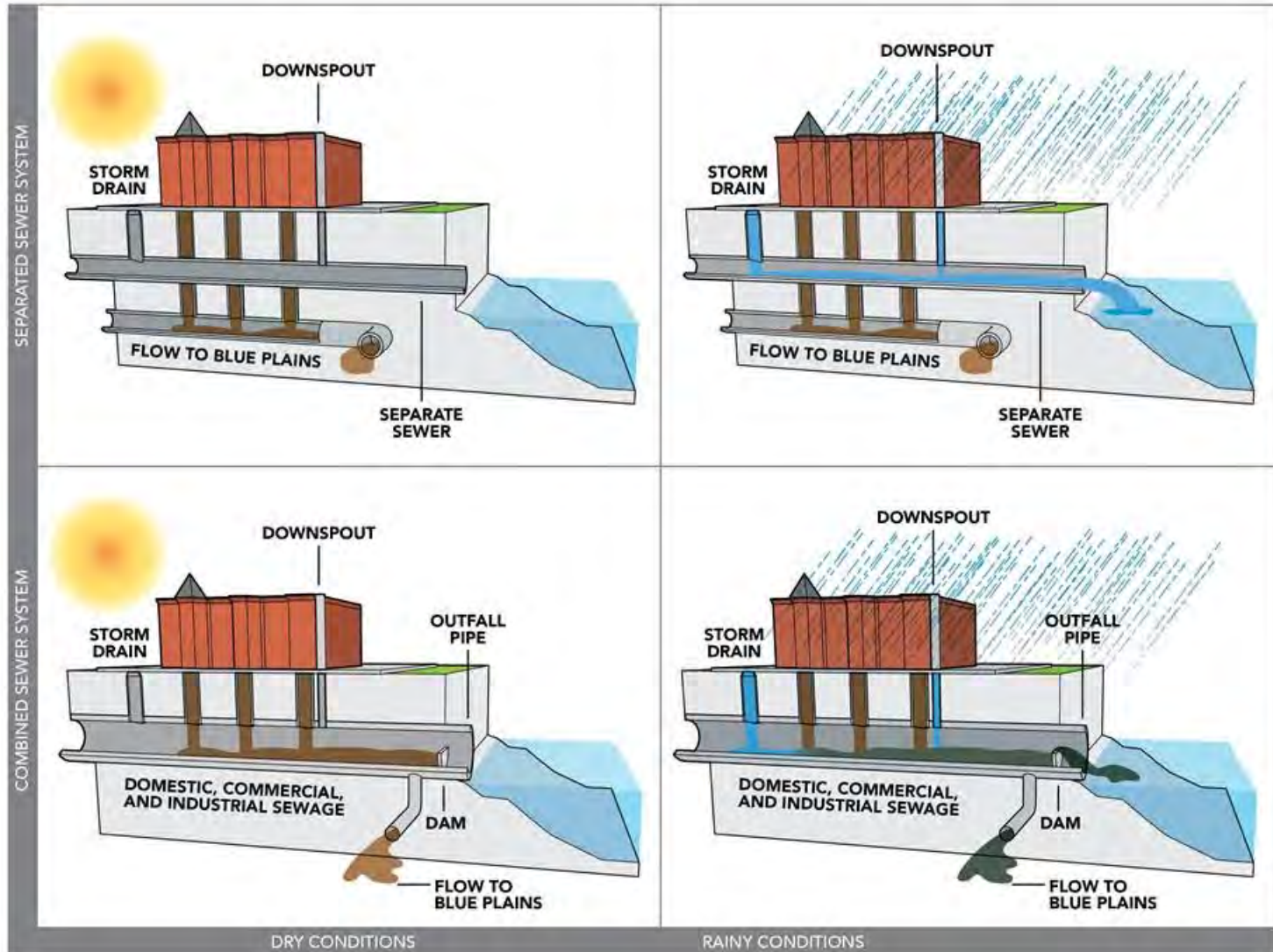


Built Environment:

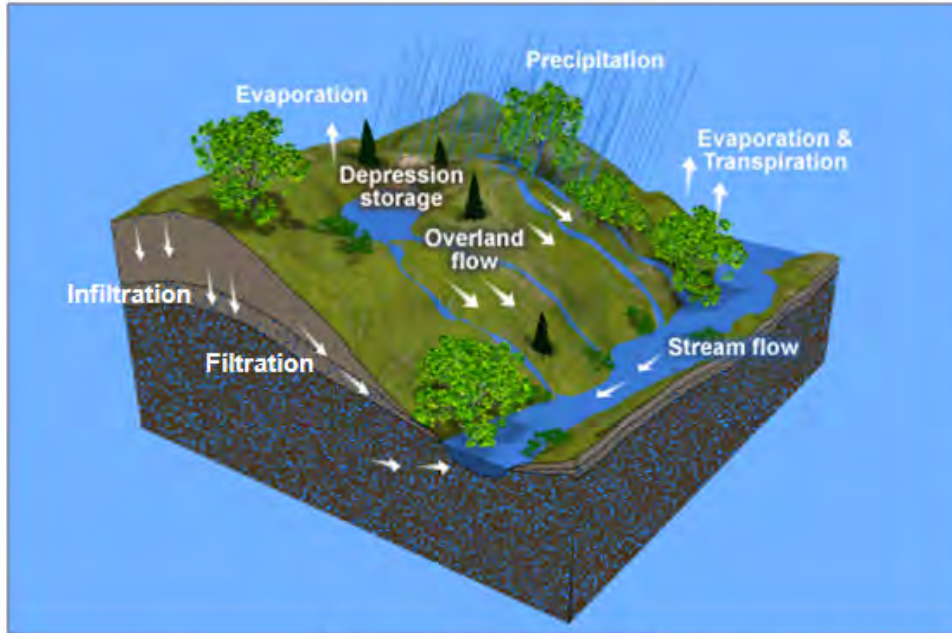
75-100% Impervious

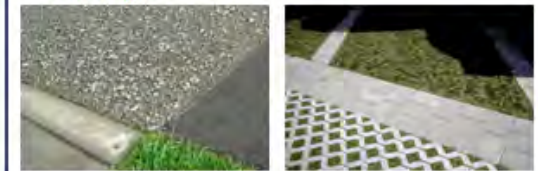

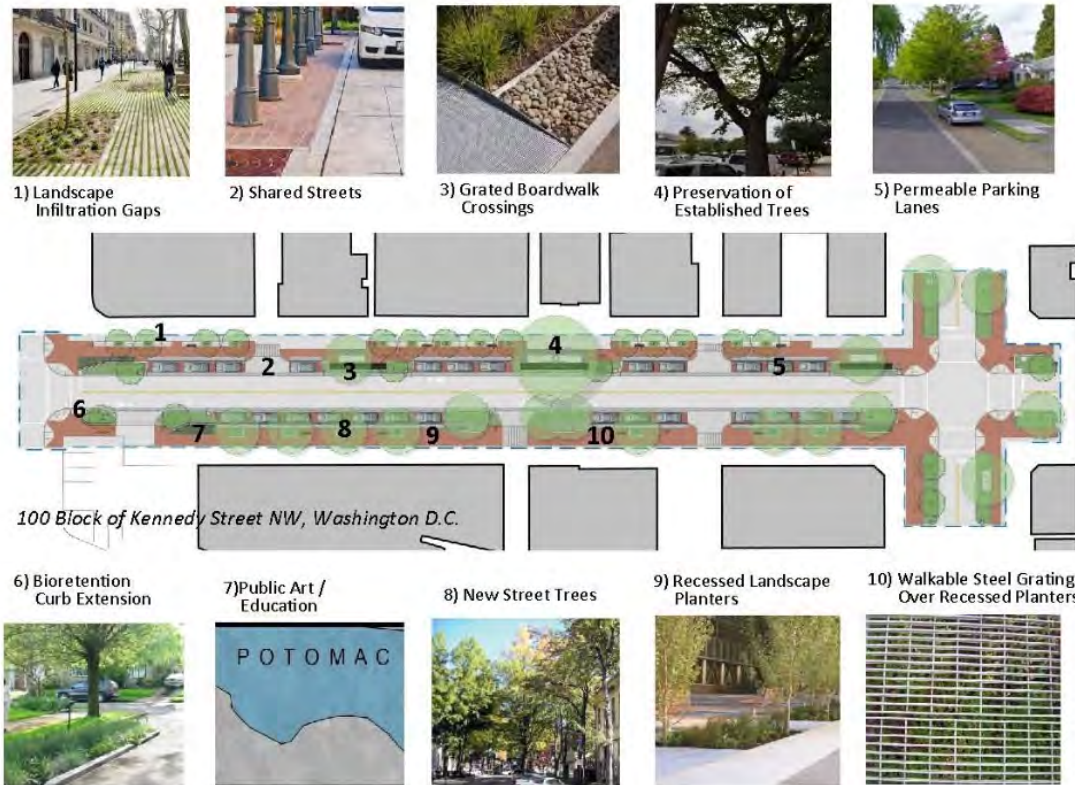

Kennedy Street GI Streetscape Project: GI Features

Features:

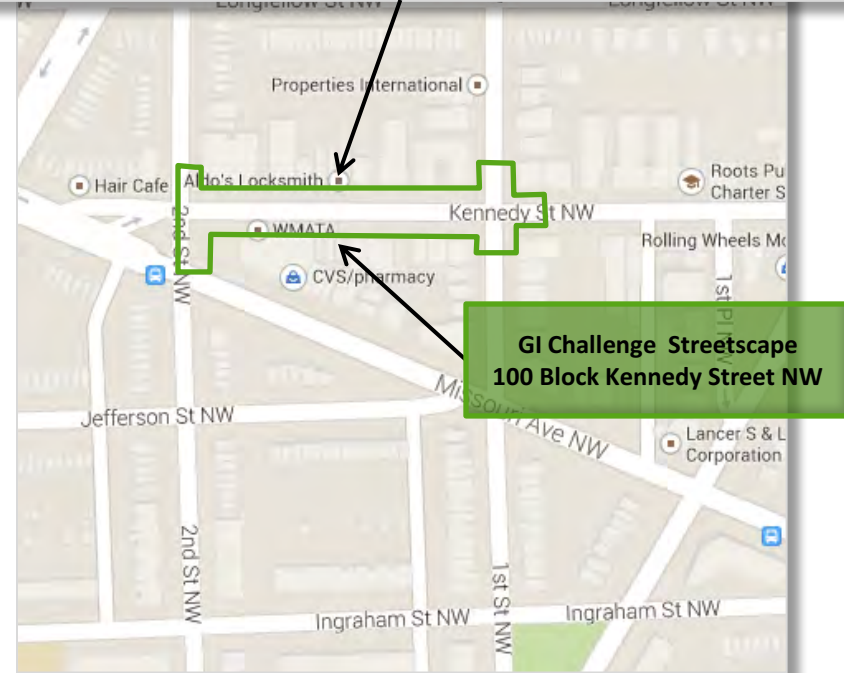
- Landscape Infiltration Gaps
- Shared Streets
- Grated Boardwalk Crossings
- New and Preservation of Established Trees
- Permeable Parking Lanes
- Bioretention Curb Extensions
- Public Art/Education
- New Trees
- Recessed Landscape Planters
- Walkable Street Grating Over Recessed Planters



Kennedy Street GI Streetscape Project: Kennedy Street Today

Kennedy Street Green Infrastructure Streetscape Project:

- Bounded by 1st Street NW and Missouri Avenue NW
 - Approximately 800' long with a right-of-way width of 60'
 - Primarily commercial site
 - Brightwood Park neighborhood
 - Characterized by broad sidewalks, a mix of recently planted trees and mature trees, and underutilized commercial properties
 - Design closely coordinated with DDOT work on Kennedy Street NW



Kennedy Street GI Streetscape Project: Maintenance of GI

- DC Water will maintain GI facilities
- DCCR's Green Infrastructure Maintenance Program goals:
 - Function
 - Ensure GI function to meet performance requirements.
 - Safety
 - Ensure public and maintenance crew safety.
 - Aesthetics
 - Ensure GI maintains the original project aesthetic goal.

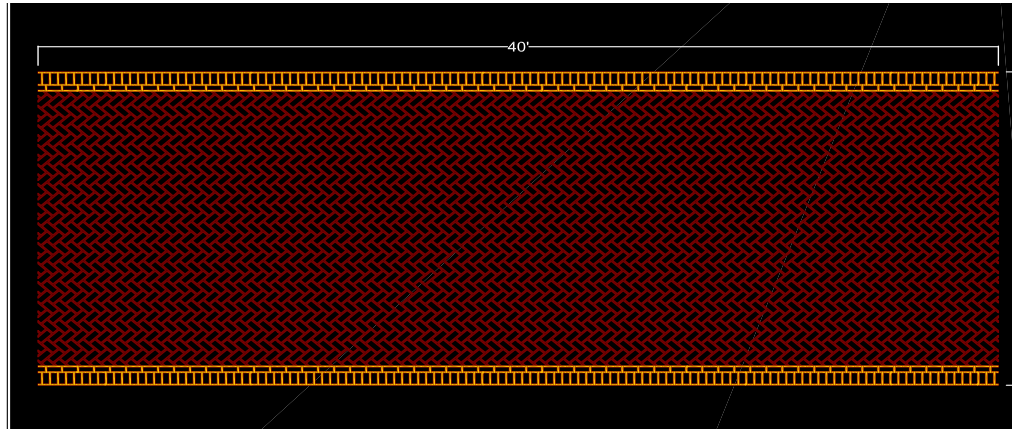
